BRS Enrollment End of Month Report – July 2016

Dear Members and Friends of the BRS School Advancement Committee:

Our team is pleased to provide this report of admission activity through July 31, 2016.

We are now in the home stretch of the Fall, 2016 recruiting season, approaching the September 30 finish line.

As such, the totals change almost daily, as applicants complete the necessary paperwork, verbal commitments become contracted students, and the occasional surprise - both good and bad - pops up.

Thus, this report is a necessary mix of hard numbers, verbal commitments, and a careful read of other good work still very much in process.

Given the above caveats, here's how we look:

Thru today, August 17, we are comparing favorably with YTD activity over the last five years and toward our 2016 goals.

Re-enrollment

- 102 returning contracts are in hand toward our goal of 104
- We have an additional 10 students who are EITHER verbal commitments which await paperwork OR are highly likely to return pending a final detail or two.
- Given this, we are projecting 109+/- at September 30, with a potential to go beyond that.

New Enrollment

- 55 new contracts are in hand toward our goal of 70
- We have an additional 8 students who are EITHER verbal commitments which await paperwork OR are highly likely to join our community.
- Given this, we are projecting 68+ at September 30, with team seeing a very achievable path all the way to 70.

Together, we have 157 contracts in hand, and project 174 – 179 students enrolled by September 30.

Obviously, this would meet our goal of 174, and would represent success in both categories - particularly in re-enrollment.

I write this with a mix of excitement and trepidation; thrilled that we are so close to complete at the earliest date in years, while still cautious that we have important work in process and about seven or eight additional new students to identify.

Bottom line - we are faring well, are energized by our yield thus far, and can project success at September 30.

Two more important items of note:

- We project that we will be +/-1% against the 70/30 domestic/international ratio across the student body likely from 20+ states and 16+ countries. Good news for sure.
- We project that we will exceed the \$2.05M Financial Aid budget by \$50,000+/-. This is because we expect to retain a greater number of returning students than planned a very happy problem to have!

41 days remain in this cycle. Our team will bring you one more report of progress on September 15th. I know you will join us in praying for smooth sailing between now and then.
